## BULLETIN FOR THE FOURTEENTH SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME

### Phased re-opening of Churches for the public celebration of Mass.

1. The obligation to attend Mass on Sunday and Holy Days has been suspended by our Bishops until the end of the current health crisis. The Bishops are encouraging those who can to attend one of the scheduled Weekday Masses so allowing greater access to the Sunday Masses for those who are working.
2. The seating capacity in all churches has been greatly reduced, so that we can adhere to social distancing at 2m. This also means that there is no mandatory requirement for face masks to be worn. A one-way system will be in operation in all churches and stewards will be on duty to assist worshippers at all public Masses and will take responsibility for sanitizing the building after each service. **IT WILL NOT BE POSSIBLE SIMPLY TO TURN UP AT THE SCHEDULED MASS TIMES. A SYSTEM OF ONLINE REGISTRATION AND/OR TELEPHONE BOOKING HAS BEEN SET UP SO THAT WE ARE ABLE TO COMPLY WITH THE RESTRICTION ON NUMBERS AND CAN BE ACCOUNTABLE UNDER THE GOVERNMENTS 'TRACK AND TRACE PROGRAMME'.**

To this end, details of all worshippers must be stored for 21 days following any visit to the church.

3. The online registration service and dedicated phone line is the same for both parishes, St Aelred's and St Robert's. This will become active, we hope, on Wednesday 8<sup>th</sup> July .

**Cafod's Response to C- 19 in Asia and the Middle East** - In the Middle East, our local experts are using your donations to continue their vital peacebuilding work and ensuring that legal advice can be given online. In the West Bank, volunteers and priests are delivering emergency food parcels to vulnerable families and we are also reaching out to Bedouin communities with health equipment and information. They are also spreading essential health messages through village posters, socially-distanced visits to families and giving out PPE. In Myanmar, local experts are working alongside health departments and the Church to provide safe places for people to quarantine themselves and to help set up track and trace systems. IN Bangladesh, they've moved quickly to give cash to the poorest families – led by widows, or those living with disabilities -to buy life-saving food and PPE during the crisis. **EU Settlement Scheme** - Exactly a year before the government's deadline for EU, EEA and Swiss citizens living in the UK to apply for Settled Status, a bishop who has gone through the process is urging people not to delay in making their application. Bishop William Kenney, auxiliary Bishop of Birmingham and himself a Swedish national, says those who are eligible should apply well ahead of 30 June 2021. The government requires European citizens who have made their homes in the UK to make an application or risk losing their fundamental rights to live and work here. Everyone including children needs to go through the process. Bishop Kenney warned that while many people have found it straightforward, others have faced unexpected obstacles navigating the government's system or don't even realise they're required to apply. He's therefore urging people to get their applications in early and encouraging parishioners to look out for others who might need some support. **RESEARCH SURVEY OF THE CATHOLIC COMMUNITY UNDER/POST COVID-19** - In partnership with Catholic Voices, Professor Francis Davis at the University of Birmingham, together with Professor Leslie Francis of the University of Warwick and Professor Andrew Village of York St John University, are currently undertaking a major survey of UK Christian responses to the present crisis and its potential impact on the future perspectives of UK Christians. This survey is intended to capture specifically Catholic experience and help us understand it better. It takes the form of an online questionnaire. They need to secure as wide a response as possible and are very keen to make sure that any member of the Catholic faithful is given the opportunity to take part so that the findings are as rich as possible.
